### **I. Title: S.C.O.P.E. Director Position**

**Description:** S.C.O.P.E. Directors are responsible for all SCOPE operations, institutionalization, and expansion. This is a 2-3 year term. We are looking for a freshman or sophomore who is looking for a program that they can really take on as their own. Ideally, this person will be looking to do more than just lead the largest premedical organization on campus. They will be looking to evolve as a premedical student, as a leader, and as a person through their experiences as the Director of SCOPE. The current directors will work with our new director for up to a year to prepare them for this leadership position, so no previous knowledge of the program is necessary.

**Term:** This position has a 2-3 year term during the school year and summer

**Supervisor:** Jennifer Miller, Medical Student Director, and Dr. Michael McCullough, Physician Founder, trained by current leadership

**Compensation:** Up to \$10-\$15/hour. Work-study available. Academic credit or internship credit available. Leadership training. First choice of shifts and clinical opportunities. Letters of reference. Ambulance rides. Potential for watching surgeries, attending pediatric clinics, and other hands-on clinical experiences. Dr. McCullough will help you with your medical school application process personally.

**Title:** SCOPE Sidekick with Dr. McCullough Positions

**Description:** You will work directly with Dr. McCullough on emergency medicine shifts. He will train you to train other SCOPE members. Dr. McCullough generally only works with the Sidekick members.

**Supervisor:** Dr. McCullough; trained by current leadership.

**Positions Open:** Immediate. Applications start now.

**Compensation:** \$10/hour for students with loans or work study. Leadership training. First choice of shifts and clinical opportunities.

Letters of reference. Ambulance rides. Potential for watching surgeries, attending pediatric clinics, and other hands-on clinical experiences.

Dr. McCullough will help you with your medical school application process personally.

**Requirements:** A good heart and consistent work ethic

#### V. **Title: BeAGoodDoctor – WebMaster**

**Description:** Webmaster needed for BeAGoodDoctor programs. Work with current webmaster, Tariq West, to manage 8 websites.

**Term:** This position has at least a 1-year term

**Supervisor:** Students will work under BeAGoodDoctor Co-Founders Jennifer Miller and Michael McCullough.

**Compensation:** \$20-\$30/hour, depending on qualifications. Academic/internship credit available. Mentorship and S.C.O.P.E. participation available.

**Time Required:** Successful candidate must be able to work 5-15 hrs/wk. Flexible hours.

#### VI. **Title: KaeMe – Summer Internship in Ghana – Intern & Videographer Positions**

**Description:** Through our strong partnership with Ghanaian government leaders in the Department of Social Welfare and our motivated BeAGoodDoctor students as the ‘boots on the ground,’ we are poised to document every child in the previously unregulated orphanage system in Ghana – decreasing each child’s vulnerability and speeding the process of finding them a healthy family. Profiles of each child, including video profiles, will help us to create a website akin to Kiva.Org or DonorsChoose.Org in which international donors can sponsor a portion of a child’s individual needs, which may include adoption, reunification with distant relatives, school funding, health insurance, etc. KaeMe, a US 501(c)3 non-profit partnered with the Ghanaian government and with a Ghanaian non-profit of the same name, is currently recruiting for 15-20 interns to serve as a work force in and around Accra, Ghana this summer. For approximately 9-10 weeks the interns will work in orphanages profiling children, collecting demographic, education, and health information as well as pictures and video footage, to ensure the Department of Social Welfare in Ghana has sufficient information to find these children a permanent home. Interns will be fully trained for the experience. If accepted, you will work closely with the Co-Founder, Dr. McCullough, Jennifer Miller, a Stanford medical student, Ghanaian social workers, Ghanaian university students, and other US college students.

**Term:** This position has an approximately 10-week summer term, with 8-9 weeks in the field.

**Time Required:** Successful candidate must be able to dedicate 10 full weeks of their summer to the program. Some training in the spring is also required. Interns are also expected to participate in KaeMe and to share their experiences once back from Ghana.

**Requirements:** Great enthusiasm, creativity, and a consistent work ethic. Multimedia experience is desired, but not a requirement.

#### X. **Title: India Clinical Internship - Summer**

**Description:** We are recruiting for student interns for a pilot internship in Dharamsala, India preferably this summer. The main goals are to establish a framework for future interns who will go to Dharamsala, as well as to gain clinical experience in the hospital. We are also looking for a co-director of the India program – an ideal opportunity for someone interested in learning to successfully implement and manage an international clinical internship.

**Description of Duties:** Specific duties will be determined during the pilot internship but will include gaining clinical experience, helping the hospital to generate revenue for the Ambulance Corps, notifying the physicians in the hospital about existing resources, and other many exciting opportunities.

**Supervisor:** Dr. McCullough, Jennifer Miller (Medical Student), Harjus Birk (Undergraduate).

**Compensation:** None. Estimated average trip cost is \$3,000. A small portion will be given directly to the hospital as a means of revenue for the Ambulance Corps.

**Requirements:** A consistent work ethic, a good heart, independence, and ability to adapt to new and different international environments. No language requirement.

**XIX. Title: HEAL Internship (Health Education & Advocacy Liaisons) in Honduras: Year-Round Internships Available**

**Description:** Through one-month to three-month internships, student interns learn about pediatric medicine and public health first-hand by working alongside American and Honduran doctors, residents, medical students, nurses, and other health care workers on the island of Roatan, Honduras. Weekday mornings are dedicated to working in the Roatan Volunteer Pediatric Clinic (RVPC), an outpatient clinic located in the Roatan Public Hospital and run by Global Healing. After mornings in the clinic, RVPC interns schedule their afternoons to work with Global Healing staff and local community health workers on projects that address local needs at the time of the internship.

**Description of Duties:** The student intern serves as Clinic Coordinator, triaging patients, updating the patient database, locating resources (i.e. meds, specialty referrals, etc.) for patients, helping them through the logistics of utilizing these resources (i.e. locating funding for trips to the mainland for follow-up care), and notifying the volunteer physicians in the clinic about existing resources.

**Supervisor:** HEAL Co-Directors Erin Dizon and Natalie Ramos, and the Global Healing directorship.

**Compensation:** None. Estimated average trip cost = \$2,000 for a one-month internship / \$4,000 for a three-month internship

**Requirements:** A good heart and consistent work ethic. Conversational Spanish language skills. Ability to be independent and adapt to new and different environments.
